

Lose twice

Derbys drop back to fourth spot

The Streetsville Derbys dropped back into fourth place in the Central Ontario Junior B hockey standings last week as a result of losses

to Oakville and Milton. The Oakville Blades humiliated the Derbys 13-4 Friday in Oakville and Milton stole an exciting 3-2 victory over the Derbys Tuesday in Streetsville.

After beating Milton twice in a row and losing by one goal Tuesday evening the Derbys walked into Oakville Friday ready to play.

Although they were outscored three to nil in the first period, they came out with the first three markers in the second frame to tie the game on goals by Danny Sutton, Frank Laciak and George

Chandler. Oakville replied with five goals of their own to end the middle frame leading 8-3 and putting the game out of reach for Streetsville.

Streetsville is missing two defencemen at present due to injuries. Brad Butterworth has a separated shoulder and Paul Howes sustained an eye injury. This breaks up two sets of partners and could be part of Streetsville's shortcomings of late.

"There is no excuse, we just played poorly," offered coach Tom Barret in response to Friday night's performance. "Defence is where we were lacking".

Shots on goal were tied at 36 apiece during the game. Oakville chalked up five more goals in the third period before Reg Henry notched the fourth goal for Streetsville in the last minutes of the game.

Steve Prest and Doug Tingy were both ejected from the game in the third period for fighting after Randy Johnson and Mark Cassidy were in the midst of another disagreement.

The Oakville attack was lead by Chapman who accounted for four of the thirteen Oakville goals.

On Tuesday the Derbys outskated, outshot (51-31) and outplayed the Milton Continental Flyers but could not put the puck in the net as they were edged 3-2 in Streetsville.

"What can I say, we played well enough to win two games to-night", assistant coach Mac Orme stated when it was all over.

Ken Fay and Bill Chapman put Milton ahead 2-0 in the first period.

Kevin Crossman made good on a power play goal late in the second period to put Streetsville's initial mark on the scoreboard.

Mike Atkinson opened the third frame with Milton playing two men short, Mike Dwyer put Streetsville back in the game with less than a minute to play.

Derbys' goaltender John Traicus warmed the bench for the remaining minute of play to keep the two man advantage over the Flyers but the Derbys put on constant pressure during that frantic final minute of play and could not tie up the game.

Coach Tom Barret summed it up by saying "It was just one of those games."

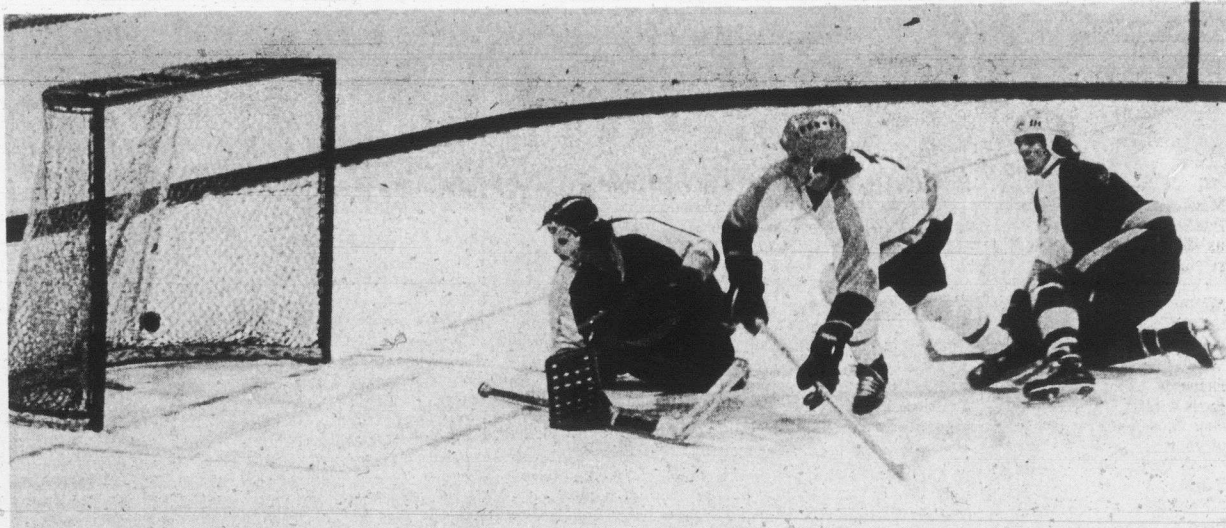

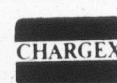

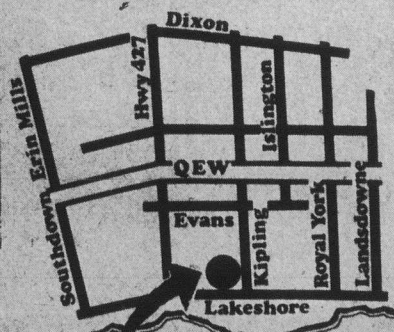
