Store at this Post and have much to regret that a loss
of that magnitude should have occurred.

It was discovered, but when too late, that all
the public Locks Keys in this Garrison are nearly the
same, and any one of those Keys was to open the
other Locks — The Commisariat Stores have
been Robbed to a considerable amount in the same
ways.
