My dear Gadsby,

I have just received your letter of 20th inst.

Since writing you I have been talking with Mr. Andrew Haydon, General Secretary of the National Liberal Organization Committee concerning our recent correspondence.

Mr. Haydon is as anxious as I am that something should be done to insure the connection you have in mind. He feels, however, that the matter is one which will have to come before the General Committee rather than be left to Mr. Lewis to determine, in as much as it will necessarily involve appropriations which only the Committee are in a position to make.

As I am only one member of the Committee, and the one, of all, least in touch with the financial end, I feel I should perhaps say at once that while as a member of the Committee I shall do all in my power to further your views, I would not like you to count with any degree of certainty upon what it may be possible for me to accomplish.
