has not yet been sold. As regards  
the former two Lots it has been  
reported to the Dept. that a quantity  
of cedar was cut thereon by the  
purchasers thereof on the first fifteen  
acres in clearing their land for  
cultivation, and as regards the  
latter lot that no timber whatever  
has been cut thereon. From a  
careful investigation that the Dept.  
has had made in connection with  
the cutting of timber on these Lots  
it does not appear that any Pine  
has been cut thereon by settlers or  
others. As regards the cedar which  
has been cut in clearing the land  
for cultivation of hard potatoes,  
that a settler Licence to cut on  
the first fifteen acres covers all  
kinds of timber except Pine and  
the
