Sir,-

Mr. Inspector Senn in his report on the Stoney Point School states that the blackboards should be repainted and a new handle provided for the one. He also says that Miss Weaver states that she has been doing the caretaking and claims that she should receive pay for that in addition to her salary as teacher.

You will be good to see that the blackboards are repainted during the summer holidays and also that a handle is made for the one.

In reference to the caretaking the Department would like you to state what part of this work the teacher has been doing, as accounts have been paid for scrubbing and cleaning of this school. If Miss Weaver will undertake to do all this work the Department will be prepared to make her an allowance of \$20.00 per annum for it.
