- Q. How many meals a day?
- A. Three, sir.
- Q. Did you have a bed while you were at the Depot?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Did you draw any blankets?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. You were enjoying the privileges of a soldier at the Depot?
 - A. Yes, sir .
 - Q. Did you draw any pay?
 - A. No, sir.
 - Q. Did you report to amybody except the Orderly Room?
 - A. No, sir.
- Q. Were there any other people at the Depot living at the Depot and working in Toronto at the same time?
 - A. Yes, sir; quite nummerous.
 - Q. Under what circumstances would that be?
- A. The men are doing nothing waiting for their discharge and they go downtown and work during the daytime.
 - Q. And you were in military uniform all the time?
 - A. Yes, sir; that's all the clothing I had.
 - Q. You said something about a pair of boets?
- A. The boots I was wearing was worn down so I went to the Quartermaster and showed them to him and he took my exfords in and gave me a pair of high boots and took my exfords to be repaired at the Depot.
 - Q. What is this document?
 - A. That is the receipt he gave me.
- Q. And it is is sued to C-49968, Pte. Freel, M. H.; is that you?
 - A. Yes, sir.
