EMPLOYMENT

Certificates of Airworthiness issued by the
Department of Transport, will be valid in one or more of the
following categories and subdivisions. (See Sections 13 and
14, Page 1.)

Normal Category

Subdivision (a) Public transport for passengers.

" (b) " " mails.

" (c) " " goods.

" (d) Private purpose aircraft.

Aerobatic Category

Subdivision (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) as for normal, and

(e) Aerial work, other than (a), (b) and (c).

- (f) Record or racing aircraft.
- " (g) Research or experimental aircraft.

evolutions causing abrupt changes in attitude and are limited in air speed to 50 per cent in excess of steady horizontal speed at normal r.p.m. Acrobatic category aircraft are not so restricted.

Operators and pilots should take note of the classification given in the certificate, especially of alternative empty weights in various subdivisions and operate the aircraft accordingly.
