THE COMMANDER OF THE FORCES requires the implicit Obedience to the following extracts of Barracks Regulations, which His Excellency has prohibited in the different Barrack Rooms.

NO Officer, or Barrack Master shall, on any pretence without *Special Authority*, convert any Barrack into a dwelling; and in order, that there may not be any mistake hereafter in any matter which concerns Barrack Masters are hereby directed, to have the use for which each Room is designed painted on the door thereof; and shall suffer Coals to be wetted, or Wood to be sawed, or split on the floors, or the floor to be injured by iron shall drive, or suffer to be driven, nails or holdfasts into the Partitions or Walls, whereby the Paint or plumb to any racks or shelves in the Rooms, the Barrack Master, (who shall visit the Barrack Rooms once every two weeks) is hereby directed, *immediately* to represent the same in writing to the Officer at the head of the Barrack Department. The Commanding Officer of each Regiment or detachment shall be answerable that the Rooms, Stair Cases, Dining and Utensils, shall be kept perfectly clean, and he shall not suffer that any Article of Barrack Furniture or Utensil be taken out of the Barrack, or applied to any other purpose than that, for which it was first intended; and shall be responsible that the Kitchens, Stair cases, Galleries, Yards, &c. &c. are regularly swept and kept perfectly clean; and shall direct, under the superintendence of the Officers, his Juniors, who shall be Quartered therein, and by
