

elle if the resolution be not so speedy, the Legislative Council send word by the Usher, they shall not need to stay for the answer, but will send it by some express Messenger of their own.

XV. At the Committee of the Legislative Council, any Member of their House, though not of the Committee, is not excluded from coming in and speaking, but he must not vote, also he shall give place to all that are of the Committee, though further down in the list, and shall sit behind them. The same order is also observed at a conference with the House of Assembly.

VI. None are to speak at a conference with the House of Assembly, but those who are of the Committee.

XVII. When any thing that hath been committed is reported, all the Members of the Committee stand up.

XVIII. No man is to enter either when the House sits, or at any Committee or Conference, unless it be such as are commanded to attend, but such as are Members of the House, upon pain of being punished severely, and with example to others.

XIX. The Members of the Legislative Council are to keep their dignity and order in sitting as much may be, and not remove out of their places, without just cause, to the hindrance of others that sit near them and disorder of the House; but when they must need go cross the House, they are to make obeysance to the Cloth of State.

XX. When any Members speak, they address their speech to the rest of the Members in general.

XXI. To prevent mis-understanding and for avoiding offensive speeches, when matters, be debated, either in the House or at Committees, it is for honor's sake thought fit and to be ordered, that all personal
