

at Lake George in the County of York, pursuant to the prayer of the Petition of Benjamin Milliken, and others, resident Freeholders of St. George in the County of Charlotte.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander-in-Chief, the sum of 100*l.* towards defraying the expense of printing the daily Journals of the present Session.

To Robert Scott, Esquire, the sum of 12*l.* : 10, being a balance due him for building a Bridge over French Brook, in the Parish of Salisbury.

And that the following was moved :—

Resolved, that there be granted to James Taylor, Senr. and Co. and William Cross, the sum of £ to remunerate them for extra expense incurred in the erection of the new College Building, it appearing that such extra expense has been incurred in consequence of the very imperfect plans and specifications upon which they were called upon to make their estimate, of the superior quality of the materials used by them, and the superior style in which the work has been executed :—£ part of the said sum, to be paid in the present year, and the remaining sum of £ in the year 1830, without interest.

And upon the question for sustaining the Resolution, the Committee divided—

YEAS 18.

NAYS 6.

It was therefore passed in the affirmative.

And for making the grant of 1000*l.* to be paid in two equal payments, 500*l.* to be paid this present year, and the remaining 500*l.* the year following, it was likewise carried in the affirmative.

That the following then passed as an amendment to the Resolution :—

Further resolved, that in the opinion of the Committee this grant should not be drawn into a precedent for allowing similar applications in future.

That there be granted to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander-in-Chief, the sum of 30*l.* in aid of individual subscription to pay a Courier to pass between Hopewell and the Bend of Peticodiac River, in the County of Westmorland.

To the Magistrates of the County of Sunbury, the sum of 150*l.* towards the payment of debts contracted in the erection of a new Gaol in that County, and in aid of finishing the same, agreeably to the prayer of their petition.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander-in-Chief, the sum of £94 : 9 : 1, for the purpose of reimbursing John Wilson, Esquire, of Saint Andrews, for that sum advanced by him to open and improve the new route, from Mowat's Hill, so called, to Chamcook, now adopted as part of the Great Road from St. John to St. Andrews, to be taken out of the sum to be appropriated for that road.

To the New-Brunswick Agricultural and Emigrant Society, the sum of 300*l.* to be applied to the encouragement of Agriculture during the year 1829.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander-in-Chief, the sum of 50*l.*, towards defraying the expense of printing the Laws of the present Session, and a further sum not exceeding 10*l.* for the purpose of having a proper Index printed to the Acts of the present Session.

That the following Resolution was moved :—

Resolved, that there be granted to Daniel Green, the sum of to redress him for injury sustained by imprisonment on a Warrant from the late Solicitor General.

And upon the question for sustaining the Resolution the Committee divided—
