the performance of Statute Labour on the Highways, and to suspend an act made and passed in the 35th year of the late King, intituled an act to alter and amend the High Road Laws."—Also

"A bill intituled "an Act to render perpetual an act intituled an act to enable the Justices of the Supreme Court of Judicature to issue Commissions for examining witnesses out of the Island,"—to which they pray the concurrence of his Majesty's Council."

On motion, the above two bills received the first reading.
