WHAT HYDRO ELECTRIC HAS DONE FOR LONDON

Mr. J. Glanville, General Manager of the Board of Water Commissioners in London, during the course of a letter of the great benefits which the people of that city have reaped by the introduction of Hydro Electric.

He shows that the average net rate is less than 4 1/2 cents per kilowatt-hour, and that in spite of this low figure, there was a surplus last year of about 5 per cent on the capital invested for private consumers. He states that the outcome is largely due to the total of 5,300 patrons, whereas the rival concern, the London Electric, has never had more than 2,700.

This year is clearly going to establish another record, as for the first two months, as compared with January and February, 1912, the receipts are \$11,000 in excess. It is estimated that thus far the direct saving to residents, because of the introduction of Hydro, is shown to be \$155,574, and on top of that there is a net cash surplus of \$17,269.

The above figures should prove good reading to Brantfordites. "BRANTFORD'S BIGGEST YEAR."

That's what this community has been able to record at the close of each succeeding year for a long time past, and without any doubt it will again be the announcement at the close of 1913. Take the building prospects as one illustration. In 1912 the total of building permits was over \$1,000,000. This time, it is expected that the aggregate would reach \$1,500,000, and perhaps more.

There is the handsome new public building, another \$500,000 building at the Ontario Institute for the Blind, two new factories expected to be landed shortly, and one of the old established concerns, if rumor speaks correctly, about to decide upon the construction of a large associate factory. In addition, house permits are pouring out as never before.

Up until the end of March, we were away ahead of the first three months of 1912—a total which at that time beat all former figures. Customs returns, post office returns, the volume of mercantile trade and all the rest of it, tell a similar story.

On top of all this, if the Lake Erie route is approved, there will be 900 men on the work of grading and track laying, and 200 men on the placing of concrete in connection with the same system, or 1,100 in all. For the post office there will also be a total of probably 125 hands.

If this good burgh isn't on the threshold of another mighty step forward this great family journal misses its guess, and candor compels the admission that it doesn't often do that.

NOTES AND COMMENTS If it happened it is in the Courier, and if it's in the Courier, it happened. This "supreme in everything" paper is getting each day to be more and more that way. The Toronto Globe states that "The Liberals will fight to the last ditch" and "expect victory shortly." Let's see! Wasn't it the same Globe which prophesied the abounding success of Reciprocity? It was a Liberal Government in the Old Land which found it necessary to curb the power of the House of Lords, and by a turn about it begins to look as if a Conservative Government in Canada might have to do just that with regard to the Senate. King Alfonso of Spain is a plucky one all right.
