



Movement Against Bolsheviki Falls

Gen. Semenov's Attempt in Eastern Siberia Has Proved Abortive

Harbin, Wednesday, June 19.—(By The Associated Press)—General Semenov's movement against the Bolsheviki in eastern Siberia has proved definitely abortive in the opinion of British and French military observers in Manchuria. Although not defeated in battle, General Semenov has been surrounded by superior forces and obliged to retreat into Manchuria, there being no other course. The Chinese authorities have demanded that he disarm and crossing the frontier and surrender his cannon and munitions. General Semenov has refused the demand, but recognizes that unless a third power intervenes the surrender of his arms is imperative.
