As per announcement Sir Mackenzie Bowell and Hon. T. M. Daly were present at the Board of Trade rooms, Victoria, on Friday afternoon for the purpose of receiving deputations and individuals relative to public matters. Dr. Duncan was the first to speak in connection with the quarantine regulations at Williams' Head, so as to prevent small-pox or cholera being imported from the Orient. He explained the subject at length, making up a personal knowledge of information gathered by him during recent visits to China and India showing that small-pox and cholera were endemic there, and on his return had received the information before the council, placed the information before the council with the result that they had communicated with the Department of Agriculture at Ottawa, asking that the same regulations should be adopted at this quarantine station on the Atlantic coast, that all the baggage of immigrants on vessels from the Oriental ports should be disinfected. DELTA MUNICIPALITY.
Delta Municipal Revenue By-Law, 1885.
