Orders the American Shipping Board have given for the construction of concrete vessels of various types, including some for military purposes, is a pretty convincing proof that they will prove satisfactory. The first big ocean-going vessel of this type, the Faith, is now well on her way across the Pacific to New Zealand, and the promoters are convinced that news of her arrival at her destination will be the signal for many orders for concrete ships.

St Andrew's College, Toronto, one of the big educational institutions of the Queen city, is to be converted into a military hospital. The expropriation cost is estimated at \$500,000 and upwards of a million will be spent in preparing a great concentration centre for the care of returned soldiers. As quickly as possible new buildings will be grouped around this centre and preparations made for the care of upwards of five thousand men. The scheme is the most comprehensive yet undertaken in Canada for wounded soldiers.

Red Cross Notes.

A large and appreciative audience listened to the lecture delivered by Miss Burleigh in College Hall on Tuesday evening. She spoke from personal experience, and the slides with which she illustrated her discourse were most interesting. Miss Burleigh is travelling in the interest of the Provincial Red Cross Society. The sum of \$97.70 was realized. The net proceeds of \$85.30 have been forwarded to the Provincial Secretary.

Well Known Man Dead.

The death of Rev. P. S. McGregor took place at his home at Chester Basin on Friday last week, after a long illness. The remains were brought to Wolfville on Saturday, accompanied by Mrs. McGregor and Miss Jean, and the funeral was held from the Baptist church on Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Rev. Mr. Harkness officiated and addresses were given by Rev. Dr. Cohoon and Rev. M. P. Freeman. The interment was at Willow Bank. The deceased was a native of Prince Edward Island and a graduate of Acadia College. He filled pastorates in different parts of the province and was an earnest and useful minister. For some time he resided in Wolfville, and many friends heard with sorrow of his death.

Registration.

The day for registration has not yet been fixed, but will probably be on June 22nd. We learn from the regulations that every person over 16 must register. The remuneration granted to the provincial or district superintendents in charge of the national registration to be held next month has been fixed at \$3 per day for the time that they are actually engaged in the work. The registrars for each constituency who are being selected by the registration board are entitled to receive \$6 per day. The registrars are empowered to appoint the deputy registrars for the different polling sections and these deputy registrars are entitled to \$4 per day. All registrars and deputy registrars have been invited to give their services free and many have agreed to do so. In hundreds of cases the deputy registrars will be women who have volunteered for the work. The total cost of the registration will, it is expected, be kept very considerably below the million dollar mark.
