LOADED SHIPS AGROUND

Easterly Winds Lower Water Several Feet In Port of Buffalo

Buffalo, March 17.—Nearly every loaded ship in the port of Buffalo has been resting on bottom all day as the result of low water at the end of Lake Erie. The level is reported several feet below normal, due to easterly winds.

The steamer H. Jones of the Becker fleet, which was to have gone to Superior elevator yesterday with her winter storage grain cargo, could not get up the river, although drawing only 18 feet. No other boats were shifted to elevators for the same reason.

Dublin, March 18.—Another Sinn Fein member of the House of Commons, Mr. Barton, representing East Wicklow, has escaped from the Mount Joy prison in Dublin. The warders found a dummy in his bed and the window bars sawed through.

NEWS BRIEFS

Wellington county lost one of its most esteemed citizens in the passing of Robert Steele, sen., in his 91st year at Pergus yesterday.

Fifty-five people were killed and 170 wounded in the riots at Halle, and 280 have been arrested for pillaging.

Prince Lichnowsky may be the next German envoy to Washington, according to a Stockholm despatch.

A Drafting Committee to prepare the final report of the Committee on Responsibility for the War has been appointed.

FOOD FOR GERMANY

(Special to the Journal)
Paris, March 18.—The British Government has indicated that immediately upon the transfer of German merchant shipping to the Allies it will be able to deliver 174,000 tons of foodstuffs to Germany.

WANT BIG INCREASE

An advance in wages equal to 25 per cent is being asked by the railway clerks, freight handlers and station employees. At a meeting held in Montreal on Saturday night the men drafted an agreement to be forwarded to the employing corporations to sign which provides for an eight hour day at the rate of 65 cents per hour.

TO GUARANTEE PAYMENT

Brussels, March 18.—The German Government has contracted to deposit 450 francs in gold in the banks here to guarantee payment for the foodstuffs supplied Germany by the Allies.

HOFFMANN ELECTED PREMIER

Basel, March 18th.—Herr Hoffmann, socialist Minister of Worship in the Eisner government has been elected Premier of Bavaria by the Diet. At the beginning of the sitting party leaders declared their adherence to the state constitution which was framed by the late premier.

CALL SENT OUT FOR BIG MASS MEETING

Brantford, March 18th.—A call was sent out today to all municipalities in the Grand River Valley, from Kitchener to Port Dover, to send municipal and business representatives to a mass meeting here, to forward the movement to deepen the Port-Dover harbor, which work was recommended by Hon. F. B. Carvell Minister of Public Works but which was struck out by the Dominion cabinet.

GERMAN BASE MUST BE SHORN OF STRENGTH

Fortifications on Island of Heligoland Must be Dismantled Decides Supreme Council.

Paris, March 18.—The fortifications on the Island of Heligoland, Germany's formidable base in the North Sea must be dismantled. This decision was reached today by the Supreme Allied War Council. It was decided also that the Kiel Canal should be internationalized and made available to ships of all nations on even terms. The disposition of German warships is not likely to be included in the treaty of Peace. Germany, however, will be required to surrender title to the ships and the ultimate ownership will be determined later.

MAKING PLANS FOR FARMERETTES

Mrs. M. C. Strath, Field Secretary of the Dominion Y. W. C. A., is with Miss Hart to arrange for the accommodation of the girls and the location of the camps with proper surroundings.

RE-INVEST WAR BOND INTEREST IN WAR-SAVINGS STAMPS

Holders of Canadian War Bonds in Canada, will draw nearly \$60,000,000 in interest this year. What will they do with it if they are wise they will re-invest a large portion of it in War-Savings Stamps. It is of the utmost importance to the country that they should do so.

Of the more than 1,000,000 holders of Canadian War Bonds, probably not 10,000 were owners of Canadian government securities before the outbreak of war. Ninety-five per cent of them had never invested in securities of any kind. The great majority probably were not regular savers.

If they do not re-invest in War Savings Stamps at least a portion of their War Bonds interest, there is grave danger that they may be lost to the large army of savers which it is desired to recruit in Canada. This would be a misfortune both to themselves and to the Dominion.

The burdens following the War are so heavy that no person can afford to waste money. Those who do so take a long chance. Not only should people save, but they should also put their savings into a security of unquestioned value that will pay well and they can get nothing better than War Savings Stamps.

DID NOT EARN DIVIDENDS

London, March 19.—The Grand Trunk Railway of Canada, owing to immense increased expenses caused by the war conditions, was unable to earn any dividend on guaranteed or preferred stocks for the past year. Dividends have so decided. These dividends have not been paid since the first half of 1917.
