

The walls are of the crude tufa-the volcanic stone of the soil around here-and are as the sides of a quarry. In the great cavity, or niche opening into the wall on a level with the floor the flowers are most profuse. In 1599 Cardinal Strondato, Titular Cardinal of the Church, opened the tomb of the blood at her feet : "not lying upon her back, like a boly in a tomb, but upon the right side, with the knees ed to see the saint, thus wonderfully preserved during fourteen centuries. 


