Days Past-362 To Come-2 GLADSTONE born 1809. The great Liberal Statesman of the latter part of the 19th century. He was elected to the House of Commons, as a Tory member when only 23. In 1852 he severed his connection with the Peel Party and on the death of Palmers ton became leader of the House in 1859, being appointed Premier for the first time in 1868. In 1874 he was in temporary retirement for a short Atrocities" he comenced a campaign to power in 1880 with an overwhelming majority. He introduced "Home Rule" in 1886 and again in 1893, and


