AMERICA'S TRADE RELATIONS.

WASHINGTON, April 9. America's commercial relation with the Allies and with the Central Powers are being studied by a Government committee to determine whether trade legislation has been made necessary by the declaration of war with Germany. Britain's "Trading with Enemy" Act and the Allies co-operation measures are under in vestigation. Although no move has been made yet toward commercial co-operation with the Allies, there is every reason to believe the United States will decide to co-operate fully in trade matters as in military affairs The Government probably immedi ately will invite the new commercia mmittees from the Allies to visit Washington. America's declaration of war has changed the whole fabric of the trade relations of this country, The United States will aid Britain in rationing northern European neutrals through which countries heretofore a vast amount of supplies has reached Germany from the U.S. Now contiguous to Germany receive from shippers only enough supplies to meet their own immediate needs. One
