Dried Fish.

The continued depression of export markets, particularly in the West Indies, naturally has had the effect of weakening the dried fish market in New York and elsewhere. This weakness is more apparent in this market than elsewhere, however, for to the Eastward a good demand has been noted from South America and in Newfoundland there has been a steady movement of stocks to Europe. The Cuban situation has been a decided disappointment. It was expected that conditions would gradually improve there, but there has been a reaction within the past week or two, which places the market again in a weakened condition. Porto Rico has not recovered from the recent overstocking with inferior quality dried fish, although there seems to be reasonable expectations that stocks will soon be exhausted—unless new supplies are received. New fish is coming into the market, and producers are holding firm for their prices. While the levels are generally lower, the new season gives promise of better market conditions. Quotations in New York remain at the levels given.—N. Y. Fishing Gazette.

The cause was the eruption of a large volcano. In the terrible shock that followed, a great range of mountains was blown completely into the air. The cavity left on the Sunda States after this explosion was one thousand feet deep. Billions of tons of rock, dust, and mud were blown heavenwards for not less than seven miles.

The reader will see what the explosion was like, when it is said that at Batavia, exactly one hundred miles away, the street lamps had to be lit, although the time was not yet noon. The sun up to this time was completely obscured; but towards sunset—the sunset that only the tropics know—came the magnificent phenomenon known to astronomers as the Blue Sun. This was seen by everyone within thirty or forty degrees of the Equator.

Saw Some Good in Germans.

Probably no other foreigner has ever been so popular in Germany as the American philosopher, Mark Twain; yet Mark understood his German, just as he understood Russia, although of the Czar's dominions he had only the tripper's knowledge he picked up with the shipload of pre-Cook's tourists that he immortalized in "Innocents Abroad."

In his "Connecticut Yankee in King Arthur's Court," Twain wrote: "There it was, you see. A man is a man, at bottom. Whole ages of abuse and oppression cannot crush the manhood clear out of him. Who ever thinks it a mistake is himself mistaken. Yes, there is plenty of good enough material for a republic in the most degraded people that ever existed—even the Russians; plenty of manhood in them—even the Germans—if one could but force it out of their mind and trample in the mud any throne that ever was set up and any nobility that ever supported it. We should see certain things yet, let us hope and believe. First, a modified monarchy, till Arthur's days were done, then the destruction of the throne, nobility abolished, every member of it bound out to some useful trade, universal suffrage instituted, and the whole government placed in the hands of men and women of the nation, there to remain." Yes, there was no occasion to give up my dream yet a while."—Acadian Recorder.
