Fresh Air—How lucky we are in St. John's to have such wonderful invigorating fresh air! Living on the side of the hill we have every benefit from it. What we must do is to make the best of it. Have windows open wide and take baby out as much as you can.

You may say the dust is bad, but when there is one room in which to cook the meals, to eat the meals, to sit in, and sometimes to sleep in, too, you want fresh air or else it gets so very stuffy. Don't you think that dust (which you can dust away) is better than that very heavy stuffiness?

Flies are another nuisance, but they seem to get in through the door anyway if the window is shut, and if we have the room airy and our lungs full of fresh air we are stronger to resist the germs they carry.

Keep the windows open at night. Sleep does us much more good if we are breathing fresh air while we sleep.

Fresh air and sunshine is a tonic for Baby which gives him red cheeks and a bonnie look.

Lets have plenty of good Newfoundland fresh air.

Crying—Baby should cry sometimes for a little while. It is good exercise for arms and legs as well as breathing organs.

It will not hurt boys any more than girls.

Prolonged crying is bad. Mother must find out the reason. It may be: Cold feet or over-heating.

Uncomfortable clothing (too tight round neck or waist).

Over-feeding or thirst.

### World's Largest Sapphire

The largest sapphire jewel in the world, which its value, unsuspected by its possessor was used as a paperweight for many years, has arrived at wembley. The jewel is a symbol of God Shan (Saturn), and it is believed that those who possess it embrace prosperity and glory.

Nine hundred and sixteen carats in weight, this sapphire has the form of a plucked flower with a few leaves around the stem.

About five years ago it was discovered by Mr. Wakefield, Director-General of Revenue, Hyderabad, Deccan, when visiting Reis Ahmed, an official of the State. On entering the office, Mr. Wakefield discovered the sapphire being used as a paperweight, and was further astonished when he was told that the official's children had played with this priceless gem as they would with ordinary stones.

The history surrounding this stone is as interesting as its value. One of the Ballala kings during the twelfth century, when on a pilgrimage to Ceylon, was given this sapphire, now called the Reis Ahmed Sapphire, by a Buddhist monk, at this time the stone was oval in shape, and was altered by expert engravers when taken back to Mysore. During the reign of the king the stone became an object of veneration, but was afterwards captured by Malik Kafur, the great general of Allaudun. Subsequent adventures brought it into the possession of Reis Ahmed's family in 1785, and its subsequent history in that family until discovered by Mr. Wakefield.

Experts are of the opinion that, as the sapphire was probably an ear ornament of some family deity, there is a companion somewhere to this wonderful stone. A fortune awaits the person who can find this companion, as the single stone itself is believed to be worth thousands of pounds.

The sapphire is of such great value that the owners, Messrs. Poochoomal Brothers, only exhibit it at certain times of the day. At other times a model is shown on their stand in the Bombay Court of the Indian Pavilion.

to circulate them. At once there were loud cries of "Read them." The Speaker on being appealed to, observed this was a matter within the discretion of the Minister.—A Conservative: Is there any necessity to follow this old man?—Speaker: It is a question for the Minister.—A Liberal: Why hit the man when he is down? Here there were some shouts of "Next question," but a more persistent demand continued that the Minister should read the statement.—Mr. Rhys Davies then stated that Bottomley had to be allowed numerous visits from his solicitor and other persons for the purpose of preparing his statement for the Official Receiver, and in connection with his appeal to the Court of Criminal Appeal. Visits were allowed

by the Prison Commissioners and the Governor under the general directions given by the Home Office. The Commissioners, added Mr. Davies, knew nothing of any diary kept by Bottomley. He had been allowed a box in which to keep the papers relating to his bankruptcy proceedings. To what extent he was allowed to hold the key could not be stated now, but the Government had access to it. The box had been examined at Wormwood Scrubs before he was removed to Maidstone. The regulations, declared Mr. Davies, had been and would be, strictly observed. On the question of good conduct marks, Mr. Davies explained that, when it became evident that an inquiry would have to be held into the whole matter

of the publication of Press articles, Bottomley was informed that he might make a statement and that he would lose nothing by frankness.—The matter then dropped.
