## Fall of Labor Government Expected at Any Moment

### Understanding Reached in Egyptian and Sudanese Questions—Extensive Scallop Beds Located in Waters Gloucester County N.B.

**UNDERSTANDING REACHED.** LONDON, Oct. 3. Conversations between Prime Minister MacDonald and Said Zangli Pasha, Egyptian Premier, on Egyptian and Sudanese questions were concluded to-day, and it was understood the two statesmen had arrived at an understanding which would form the basis for future negotiations on the question of the removal of troops from the Cairo district and from Imperial communications system in Egypt. Premier Zangli declared, after to-day's conference, that he had made no demands on the British Government but that his suggestions had met with Mr. MacDonald's approval. He will return to Egypt to-night, and it is expected he will submit the result of his conversations to Parliament which will convene in November.

### FALL OF LABOR GOVERNMENT PREDICTED.

LONDON, Oct. 3. "It certainly looks as though a crisis might come at any moment, but then in politics you never can tell," is the utterance of ex-Premier Stanley Baldwin in referring to the position of the Labor Government in face of recent happenings. His note of caution is received by many political observers who have watched beside the supposed deathbeds of previous Governments which ultimately proved to be very much alive. The majority of political writers in the press, however, adopt the view widely held in the lobbies of parliament and party clubs, namely, that the present administration's days are numbered and it is bound to fall if not on a Conservative motion of censure in Communist matters then on the Opposition to the Anglo-Russian Treaty headed by the Liberals. Outside political circles complaints are beginning to be heard, as nobody wants another election.

### AUSTRALIAN POSITION ON PROTOCOL.

MELBOURNE, Oct. 3. Premier S. M. Bruce, in a speech in the House of Representatives, with regard to the compromise arrived at with Japan at Geneva on the League of Nations arbitration protocol, said that unless there was something in the protocol which interfered with Australia's rights, there would be no need for Australia to take special action in the matter.

### BOUNDARY BILL BEFORE HOUSE OF LORDS.

LONDON, Oct. 3. The House of Lords to-day gave the first reading to the Irish Bill providing for a commission to adjust the boundary between Ulster and the Free State which yesterday passed its third and final reading in the House of Commons. The Marquis of Salisbury pointed out that several members of the Lords desired to address their comments on the matter and suggested that the debate in connection with the second reading be taken Tuesday or Wednesday. To this proposal the Lord Chancellor assented on behalf of the Government.

HAMILTON, Ont., Oct. 30. ### CONFESSES TO TRIPLE MURDER.

OTTAWA, Oct. 3. John Buchanan Pierie, now in jail on triple charge of murdering his wife and two children, Joan, aged 6 and Kathleen, aged 7, early Wednesday morning, has finally confessed to the authorities that he killed all three by strangling them. The confession states that shortly after daylight Wednesday Pierie went to the bedroom in which his wife and Joan were sleeping and picking up a heavy stick struck the wife on the head and stunned her. He strangled her to death and then strangled Joan. Kathleen who was sleeping in another room got up and was running toward her father when, according to the confession, he picked her up and strangled her.

### ANTICIPATING DEBATE.

OTTAWA, Oct. 3. The arbitration protocol adopted by the assembly of the League of Nations is expected to give rise to considerable debate next session of the Dominion House of Commons. While the Canadian delegates at the assembly supported the protocol, final appeal will, it is assured, lie with the Dominion Parliament. This was the procedure adopted in respect to the League convention itself.

### KING OF HEDJAS ABDICATED.

CAIRO, Oct. 3. King Hussein of Hedjas who has been holding the Holy City of Mecca against Warring Wasabi tribesmen has abdicated according to despatches received here to-day.

### JAPAN NOT TO INTERFERE.

TOKIO, Oct. 3. Baron Kijuro Shidehara, Japanese Foreign Minister, to-day in an interview reiterated the Government's declared step in regard to China, asserting that Japan must refrain absolutely from any intervention as she expects a similar policy will be carried out by other countries.

### BOSTON AND GLOUCESTER FISHERMEN ORGANIZE.

BOSTON, Oct. 3. Co-operative organization among Boston and Gloucester fishermen, has been launched to secure to men who sail to the banks, a larger share of profits from their catches. With more than a thousand members already recruited, the leaders of the movement have set a goal of 1,800, a number which they assert will give them control of 85 per cent. of the catch of both fleets. The co-operative partnership will have a central selling agency, under the direction of a corps of merchandizers. The organizers said that "forcing wholesale dealers to meet a standardized price and an advertising campaign to extend the market of the fleet, through wider sections of the country will be undertaken by them soon."

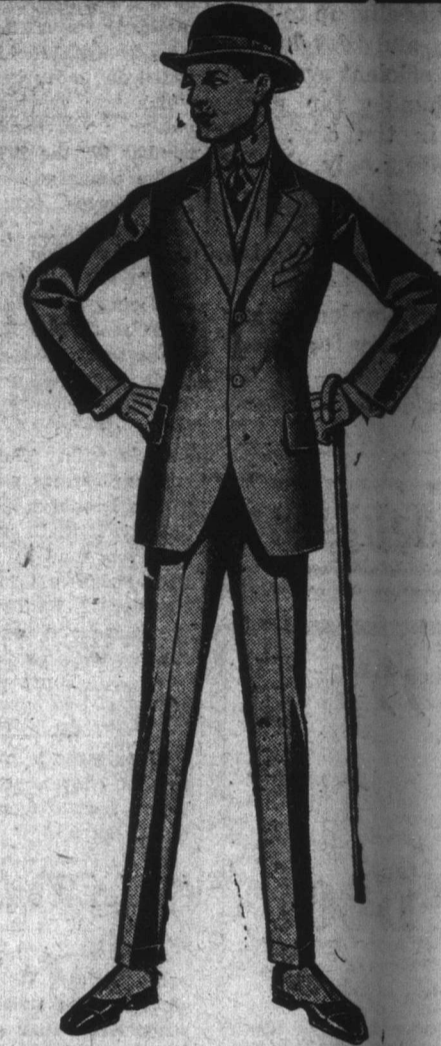
