Stewed figs on rice with cream make an appetizing change for the breakfast cereal.

Whites of eggs in pumpkin pies make it water proof, and the yolks of eggs and cream, not milk.

Crab apples make excellent timber for winter shortcakes. Pare, core and cook with as little water as will prevent burning. Sweeten as for table use and can.

Biscuits and rolls should be allowed to rise one-half longer than bread because the leaves of the former, being smaller, are more easily penetrated by the heat and the fermentation is more speedily arrested; therefore they do not rise so much in the oven.
