The residents of Hyde Park, a Chicago suburb, are having much difficulty with their gas. Within seven days six people have been suffocated and ten times that number have narrowly escaped suffocation. The gas, which is largely used for fuel, is odorless, and its presence cannot be detected save by the heaviness of the atmosphere. Wednesday night the pressure was so low that in places where people left the gas burning the joints were extinguished. Later the pressure was increased and the houses became filled with gas.
