



A COLD DIP.

The Mercury Tries to Bore Its Way Through the Bottom of the Eulb. TORONTO, Feb. 25 .- The nights of Friday and Saturday were, from all accounts, the coldest of the season, the mercury registering many degrees below zero, as shown below:
