

POSTMEN DEMAND LAW TO ALLOW GOVT. ACTION

Ultimatum Is Sent To Parliament by Executive of Federation Calling For Change in Law Giving Power To Government To Deal With Critical Situation.

FIX TIME LIMIT OF TWENTY-FOUR HOURS

Toronto, June 16.—The Dominion executive of the Canadian Federation of Postal Employees passed a resolution this afternoon, which was forwarded to Ottawa tonight, calling on parliament to amend the federal act so that the government would have power to deal with the situation caused by the postal employees' refusal to accept the salary schedule recommended by the civil service

This action by the executive of the federation was taken in view of the statement by Premier King that final power in regard to the salaries of the civil servants rests with the civil service commission, and the government is powerless to interfere unless the act is amended

The government and parliament, federation officials said, have been given 24 hours in which to make a satisfactory reply, and if it is not forthcoming by tomorrow night they expected a strike call will be issued at once. It was explained that a strike could not be called until all the returns from the voting had been received, which will be tomorrow night at 6 o'clock.

Strike Favored.

Officials intimated tonight that every return from the men received so far, and which includes a large portion of the Dominion, has shown a majority in favor of a walkout if the schedule recommended by the civil service commission is insisted






