Lieut-Governor Carvell, of Prince Edward Islano, about a year ago refused to give assent to a bill passed by the Local Legislattree abolish-ing the Legislative Council, but reserved the same for approval or disapproval of the Gov-ernor-General in Council. The bill has now been returned to the Lieut. Governor by dis Excellency, with the instructions that he should have either assented to it or taken the responsi-bility of disallowing it, since it was a matter which lay entirely within the competency of the Province to deal with. The supplementary estimates were laid on the table to-day. The total amount is \$1,245,654.04, chargeable as foll ws:-To capital, \$270,200; to consolidated ind, \$814,2%.64: to territorial ac-counts, \$3,000; to unprovided items, 1891-2, \$158,-247.40.
