Bismarck's Short Speeches. LONDON, Jan. 15.—The utterances of Prince Bismarck in the Reichstag to-day were embodied in nine short speeches, in-stead of one elaborate address. This fact is taken to indicate the Chancellor's de-sire to avoid giving annoyance to England. The opposition abstained from provoking reference to the Morier and Geffcken in-cidents and the Chancellor did not allude to them.
