MEXICO WILL HOLD OPEN DOOR

To Nationals Having "Wholesome Ideas of Citizenship."

Mexico City, Aug. 1.—Mexico will hold open the door to nationals of all countries who can show that they possess wholesome ideas of citizenship, and will not be a disturbing element in the nation, President Carranza told the correspondent of the Associated Press today in an interview during which the chief executive commented at length on various phases of Mexico's problems.

Referring to the oil problem, President Carranza said: "Mexico is not opposed to the petroleum companies or to any other foreign industries. We merely require that if such companies are to operate in the republic they abide by our laws. The passing of a new oil law is now in the hands of Congress."

IRELAND'S LABOR SITUATION BETTER

Work is plentiful in all lines but Linen Manufacturing.

There is a steady improvement in industrial conditions in Ireland, and this was more noticeable during the past few weeks than it has been for some time. In Belfast—the hub of Irish industries—there is an insistent demand for production, and with the exception of the linen trade practically all the industries in that city might safely be said to be passing through a boom period.

Work is plentiful at the shipyards, and existing contracts are being carried through as quickly as possible. There is still a number of ships under reconstruction after service with the Admiralty, and the work in connection with these is also being pushed forward as rapidly as conditions will warrant. Messrs. Harland & Wolff's new shipyard on the east side of Mungrace Channel is steadily assuming a complete appearance. Construction is taking place on one vessel, and five other ships are being got ready. In the engineering and building trades work is more plentiful, and conditions are becoming more settled.

RIOTS IN EVERY CANADIAN CITY.

Plan of the Reds to Take Over Reins of Government

Winnipeg, Aug. 1.—The Calgary labor convention, last March, at which the One Big Union was given form, was packed with "reds" as members of the socialist party of Canada are known in labor circles. The plans of the reds were to start in every city, town and village of Canada at one time, with the definite object of taking over the reins of government.

R. E. Russell saw in the coming unemployment situation a "glorious opportunity to show the 'plug' that the only solution to the question is the situation in Russia."

A veritable flood of propaganda, including distribution of barrel literature, Socialism and Bolshevism, was distributed by R. E. Russell and other members of the Socialist party of Canada.

This is the substance of letter seized by the Royal Northwest Mounted Police, under a search warrant, at the home of Russell, in Vancouver, B. C., last Thursday afternoon at the preliminary trial of the eight labor leaders for seditious conspiracy.

JAPANESE WIVES IN CALIFORNIA.

Total Japanese Population in State Only 41,356.

By the latest Federal census the women of California numbered 1,054,571. The total Japanese population amounted to 41,356.

In view of these figures, Senator Phelan's alarming discovery that the fecundity of Japanese women in California is crowding the white people off the land, subverting American institutions and foreshadowing the end of our Western civilization suggests a flavor of exaggeration, to say the least of it. Reasoning from the same premises, it must be that the Senator's sensational claim of a 3,000 per cent. increase in the Japanese birthrate and a 9 per cent. decrease in that of the whites must be false or relatively misleading.

When Japanese immigration was stopped by agreement, exceptions were made in behalf of the wives of laborers already here. It is the fashion now in California to question the standing of these "wives," always in quotation marks, but the fact that they are rearing families ought to count for something in their favor. It is to be said furthermore in their defense that they and their husbands and their progeny are industrious and thrifty, and that so far as is known they have organized no societies intent upon overthrowing the Government of the United States.
