A BRIEF COMPARISON
(Experimental Farms Note.)
At the Central Experimental
Farm, comparisons of the feeding
value of the three silages - oats,
peas and vetch, sunflower, and corn,
showed the cost of production of
these stored in the silo to be \$5,60,
\$1.80 and \$2.95 per ton, respectively
In the first part of the experiment, corn silage produced 4% more
milk at 13.5% less cost and 3.7%
more fat at 12% less cost than they
did the 0. P. V. silage. In the second part of the experiment, corn
