City Engineer's Report.

In his ordinary fortnightly report, which will be submitted to the new Board of Works on Monday, City Engineer Keating states that to avoid any disputes he forwarded copies of the proposed plans and specifications in connection with the widening of Queen-street subway to the G.T.R. and C.P.R. Cos. Mr. Leonard of the latter company has raised several objections to the proposed plans, contending that the retaining walls have no right to be placed upon any portion of the C.P.R. property, and that no provision should be made for the future ewastension of Dufferinstreet northwardly from Queen-street, as that theroughfare was closed under an order of the Railway Committee of the Privy Council, Mr. Leonard also takes the eground that as the present subway was constuced under an oder of the Privy Council, that any alteration in it cannot be made without bringing the matter again before that body and getting an order from it on the subject.

The frontage liable to assessment is \$18 lineal feet, and the approximate cost per foot frontage is 69 cents.

Mr. Keating thinks that the time is now opportune for transferring the plumbing department to the Medical Health Office if it is deemed advisable.
