THE MONTREAL POULTRY, PIGEON AND PET STOCK ASSOCIATION.

The Montreal Poultry Pigeon and Pet Stock Association have secured the Natural History Society Hall on Cattaract Street for holding their annual exhibition which takes place on January 11th, 12th and 13th 1887. The Tilsonburg Poultry Association will hold their first annual exhibition of live and dressed poultry on Monday and Tuesday, 20th and 21st of December 1886. \$150 in prizes. Birds to be judged by a competent judge. W. S. Law, Secretary and Treasurer.
