Grapes, Hothouse:

A VALUABLE paper on DAIRY PRODUCTS was recently read at the London Farmers' Club, by Mr. G. M. Alexander, of Belgrave mansions, who started by an expression of his firm conviction that dairyfarming will be found far more profitable than it is supposed to be, if entered upon on a large scale, made a thorough business of, and all modern improvements and appliances introduced. In the north of Europe, Denmark, Jutland, Holstein, &c., great advances have been made, as for example :- Copenhagen, 1860: " Butter execrably bad, strange such produce could find a sale." Copenhagen, 1876: "The butter commands high prices in all quarters of the globe." This remarkable change was effected by the exertions of, and attention given to the subject of dairy management by, men of talent and position. Similar influences are at work in other countries-Sweden, where Prof. Muller, now removed to Berlin, did so much; Germany, Austria, Bavaria, Switzerland and France, not forgetting America. Dairy schools are to be found all over Europe, in which instruction is given by men of the highest intelligence. The work of the dairy, whether it be the production of cheese or butter, requires greater attention, and more careful obser-
