For saws, mowers, buggles, and the like, this mixture furnishes more body with less guest than used other oils. The amount of kerosene-if any, to be added, must be governed by the purpose for which it was designed.

A FRENCH journal states that chloride of lime scattered about where rate and mice frequent will cause them to desert the spot. A solution of it brushed over plants will effectually protect them from insects. It scattered over ground infeated with grabs, it will free it from them entirely. Bunches of cotton or tow smeared with a mixture of chleride of lime and hog's lard, and tind about in different parts of a tree, will guard it against the halack of insects, slugs, grubs, etc., and drive away those already in possession.

FOR beef erequettes take cold roast beef Fox beef crequettes take cold roast beef or veal, mince it first; chop up together a small onion, sweet marjoram, a little powder, ed cloves; moisten with beef gravy, and make up the whole mixture into oval shapes; dredge with bread crumbw, before moistening in yolk of egg after, to secure a crumby surface; plunge in frying-basket for a few minutes until the outside is a golden brown. Remember that croquettes are always made of meat which has been previously cooked, and only need to be marw inside and brown without.
