

It is the feeling of the Government of Canada that this Modus Vivendi has had a favourable effect in the development of the commercial relations between Canada and Venezuela. For this reason, I have the honour to propose to Your Excellency that this Modus Vivendi be extended for another period of one year from the 11th of October 1959.

If Your Excellency's Government concurs in this proposal, I suggest that this Note, together with Your Excellency's reply, constitute an agreement between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Republic of Venezuela to extend the Modus Vivendi of the 11th of October, 1950*, for another period of one year.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.

EXCELLENCY,

I have the honour to refer to Your Excellency's note No. 80 of October 10, 1959 in which you tell me of the interest of your Government in extending for an additional year, as from October 11, 1959, the Modus Vivendi which governs the commerce between Venezuela and Canada.

Taking into account the beneficial effect that this instrument has had on the trade relations between both countries, I have been authorized to reply to your Excellency accepting the proposed renewal.

Consequently, this Note, together with yours aforementioned, will constitute an agreement between the Government of the Republic of Venezuela and the Government of Canada for the renewal, for a period of one year, until October 11, 1960 and under the same terms the Modus Vivendi, originally signed on October 11, 1950*.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurances of my highest and distinguished consideration.
