

to respect the territorial integrity and political independence of States and the obligation to settle disputes by peaceful means;

3. Resolves to consider, in relation to specific principles of international law of immediate and universal concern such as those referred to in paragraph 2, the development of the rules of international law and international procedures with a view to the more effective application of those principles;

4. Decides accordingly to inscribe on the provisional agenda of its XVIIIth Session the topics of the obligation to respect the territorial integrity and political independence of States and of the obligation to settle disputes by peaceful means;

5. Requests the Secretary-General to invite Member States to transmit written comments concerning the topics referred to in paragraph 4, and to communicate those comments to Member States before the beginning of the XVIIIth Session.
