Sections 1 to 11 inclusive agreed to.

Bill reported.

Mr. Benidickson moved the third reading of the bill.

Mr. Howard C. Green (Vancouver-Quadra): Mr. Speaker, the remarks which have been made on the Alberta Natural Gas Company bill apply in many respects also to the present bill. In order to be consistent, I propose to move, seconded by the hon. member for Nanaimo (Mr. Pearkes), the same amendment to this bill:

That Bill No. 9 be not now read a third time but that it be referred back to the standing committee on railways, canals and telegraph lines for the purpose of reconsidering the amending of the bill so as to provide that any pipe lines built by the proposed company from Alberta to the Pacific coast must be by an all-Canadian route.

Mr. Speaker: Is the house ready for the question on the amendment?

Mr. H. W. Herridge (Kootenay West): As the remarks I made on the previous bill, Mr. Speaker, apply to this bill also, and as I do not wish to take up the time of the house further, I wish to move the following amendment, seconded by the hon. member for Yale (Mr. Jones):

That the amendment be amended by adding thereto, immediately after the last word thereof, the following words:

"and also so as to provide for the regulation of the tolls and tariffs of the proposed company for the protection of Canadian consumers."

In conclusion, I might say that once again we offer to members of this House of Commons the opportunity to protect Canadian interests, Canadian rights and Canadian consumers.
