Adjournment Debate

The reason why a 3 per cent warranty cost is imposed is, Mr. Speaker, that statutory expenses for CSLP have increased from 300 millions dollars, in 1985–1986 to 442 millions in 1990–1991.

When a student does not refund his loan to the financial institution according to the pre-conditions, it is the government that refunds the institution and takes charge of the grievance procedure with the students at fault. I do not know if my colleague knows how many they are and how they do that, but it is terrible.

Mr. Speaker, the commitment of the government to helping the postsecundary students remains as firm as it

has been since the creation of this program, 27 years ago. Our government is also committed to reduce the national deficit.
