

And the question of concurrence being severally put on Resolutions 338 and 339; they were agreed to, *on a division*.

And the question of concurrence being severally put on Resolutions 340 to 350, inclusive; and 352 to 367, inclusive; they were concurred in.

The House then went again into Committee of *Ways and Means*.

(*In Committee.*)

The following Resolutions were adopted:—

1. *Resolved*,—That towards making good the *Supply* granted to Her Majesty for the financial year ending 30th June, 1880, the sum of \$1,712,346.55 be granted out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Canada.

2. *Resolved*,—That towards making good the *Supply* granted to Her Majesty for the financial year ending 30th June, 1881, the sum of \$23,301,208.76 be granted out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of Canada.

Resolutions to be reported.

The said Resolutions were accordingly reported, read a second time, and agreed to,—and the Committee to sit again, *to-morrow*.

Sir *Leonard Tilley* then introduced a Bill No. 126 for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of money required for defraying certain expenses of the public service, for the financial years ending respectively the 30th June, 1880, and the 30th June, 1881; and for other purposes relating to the public service; which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading, *to-morrow*.

The Bill No. 115 to amend “An Act relating to Banks and Banking,” and to continue for a limited time the Charters of certain Banks to which the said Act applies, was read the second time, and considered in Committee of the Whole.

And The House having continued to sit until 12 of the clock, midnight;

And progress having been reported,—the Committee obtained leave to sit again, at the next sitting of The House, *this day*.

The House then adjourned at 20 minutes after 1 o'clock A.M.
