PRAYERS

Mr. Lang for Mr. Whelan, seconded by Mr. Mackasey, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-30, An Act to repeal the Prairie Farm Assistance Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Administrator pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Administrator recommends to the House of Commons a measure to repeal the Prairie Farm Assistance Act and provide that all moneys remaining in the Prairie Farm Emergency Fund shall be credited to the Consolidated Revenue Fund and held in trust to transfer to any fund subsequently established by Parliament for the purpose of stabilizing prairie grain receipts.

Ordered,—That there be laid before this House a return showing, by electoral districts, the total amount of election expenses on behalf of each candidate in the General Election of July 8, 1974, as indicated in the return respecting election expenses submitted on behalf of each candidate, as required under the provisions of Section 63 of the Canada Elections Act; and showing also, by elec-

toral districts, the names of all candidates on whose behalf election expense returns have not been submitted.—*(Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 1—Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre).*

Ordered,—That there be laid before this House the production of papers showing the studies prepared by departments or agencies which permitted the Department of Manpower and Immigration to make the allocations for LIP projects among the various constituencies.—*(Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 4—Mr. Orlikow).*

Ordered,—That there be laid before this House copies of all correspondence, telegrams and minutes of meetings between the Minister of Veterans Affairs and the National Veterans Organizations having to do with the report of the Study Committee on the basic rate of pension, during the years 1972, 1973 and 1974.—*(Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 6—Mr. Marshall).*

Ordered,—That there be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence, telegrams and minutes of meetings between the Government and the National Veterans
