

THIRD OF CANADA'S BUILDING IN JULY WAS DONE BY TORONTO STRONG POSITION IS MAINTAINED

For First Seven Months City Is Two Millions Ahead of Last Year's Record and Six Millions Ahead of Any Other City—All Canada's Figures Not Quite So Bright, But Local Real Estate Owners Have Cause For Rejoicing.

During July the decline in building was more accentuated than during any month to date this year, says the Financial Post. The aggregate permits, as shown in the accompanying table, show for the month a decrease of 24 per cent. while for the first seven months the figures show a decrease of 8 per cent. from the totals for the corresponding period of last year.
