## Lacrosse Decadent Says Montreal Vet.

A writer in The Montreal News dis cusses lacrosse as follows Certain newspapers are concerned over lacrosse, Canada's national game, and express a desire to revive interest in the sport. The desire is shared by a large number of good Canadians, who have watched with some concern the fall of lacrosse from public favor in recent years. Years.
The papers agree that professionalism The papers agree that professionalism is responsible for the ills of lacrosse. That this conclusion is erroneous, we think, is patent from the fact that the other great Canadian game, hockey, is professionalized up to the limit and yet retains its popularity with the general public. The ability of hockey to withstand the orslaught of "professionalism" suggests that we must look for some other influence than that of "high finance" to explain the present troubles of lacrosse. It is my belief that the ascendency of some other summer games over la-crosse is natural and -was inevitable. Lacrosse is an exacting game. It is a contribution to modern life from a past generation that was in physical condition to withstand the demands it made upon the stamina of the player, but the young men of today do not keep in such physical condition as to be able to the physical condition as the physical condition to the physical condition to

cal condition as to be able to play and enjoy lacrosse as did the young braves Professional lacrosse in Canada was Professional lacrosse in Canada was once described by a wag as follows: "You begin to run on the first of April and you run till the end of September. You cover the distance between Halifax and Vancouver twenty times, and, if you have any breath left, you spend the rest of the year asking for back salary." This is an exaggeration, but the fact remains that lacrosse demands unusual physical endurance.

Professionalism is to blame in that it Professionalism is to blame in that is permitted hooliganism on the field to accelerate the fall of lacrosse from public favor. But lacrosse was due to fall

accelerate the fall of lacrosse from public favor. But lacrosse was due to fall anyway. Baseball is responsible, more than anything else, for the public's action in turning its back upon the older game. Beseball came into Canada from the United States. It demands of the player less physical exertion, and more mental activity, than lacrosse calls for. Today, baseball is more popular in Canada—that is, more generally played—than lacrosse is, more generally played—than lacrosse ever was or ever is likely to be. If it were not for the professional game dacrosse probably would be unheard of in Eastern Canada at this time. 
