LEXINGTON, Oct. 11.—After losing his first heat to Austin, Peter Scott, owned by Henry Oliver of Pittsburgh, won the William Hays Sneyd stake and cup, the principal event of the Grand Circuit races today, taking the last three heats in easy style.
