Review Day at the Fair, not still in line, for it beat any previous Review Day on record. The manager and superintendent and directors and everyone down to the ticket-takers are joyous down to the very bones at the Fair \$25,000 ahead of last year. Every day has beaten the same day of last year.

Receipts. Hon. Mr. Davis, who was introduced as "Farmer Davis," said that one of the best things that could be said of the Fair this year was that the receipts were over \$20,000 larger than last year.

President Withrow Recants. SPAIN'S PEACE BILL

Full Text of the Measure Over Which There Have Been Bitter Scenes in the Cortes.

London, Sept. 9.—According to the Madrid correspondent of The Times, the following is the text of the bill authorizing the Government to conclude peace.

The Government, whose moderate language will not be found fault with by the representatives of the nation, limits itself to submitting to the Cortes the following bill, whose first and only article is:

The Government is authorized to renounce its rights of sovereignty and jurisdiction in the Spanish colonies in accordance with the peace preliminaries agreed upon with the Government of the United States of America.

Madrid, Sept. 9.—The following statement has been made by an important Spanish official: "Senator Sivola (the leader of a section of the Conservative party) refuses the Government the support of his party, although he is fully aware of the difficulties of the situation. He is doubtless prompted by the desire to obtain power. We will do all in our power to realize his desire with short delay. The country will then see how soon the man who is now posing as a Liberal will be transformed into a despot dictator."
