IMPERIAL MOVEMENT IN SOUTH AFRICA.

London, May 6.—In moving in the House of Commons to-day a formal resolution guaranteeing the Transvaal loan of \$175,000,000, Colonial Secretary Chamberlain delivered a lengthy, optimistic speech on the future of the new South African colonies. He explained that it had been decided to purchase all the existing railways, which would absorb \$85,000,000, of the new loan and \$25,000,000, more will be expended as \$65,000,000 of the new loan, and \$25,000,000 more will be expended as quickly as possible on the development of railways; \$12,500,000 would be spent on land settlement, and \$10,000,000 on public works. The Chancellor of the Exchequer, Mr. Ritchie, declined to reveal the rate of interest in advance of the issuing of the prospectus. After some lebate the resolution was agreed to.
