MILLERAND CALLS ON LEYGUES TO FORM NEW MINISTRY BRITISH COAL MINERS' STRIKE CALLED FOR TODAY IS POSTPONED

GERMANY FACING HUGE DEFICIT MAY CONFISCATE COAL MINES IN EFFORT TO OBTAIN FUNDS

Herr Wirth, Minister of Finance, Forces Cabinet To Take Action To Overcome Gigantic Losses—Charges That Bad Conditions Are Due To Maladministration—Total Debt of Country Is 242,700,000,000 Marks.

Berlin, Sept. 24.—Under a threat of resigning his post and thereby precipitating a crisis, Herr Wirth, minister of finance, yesterday not only succeeded in forcing the cabinet to take action to overcome the problem of the nation's tangled finances, but also obtained for himself an ascendancy in governmental affairs.

At an extraordinary session of the cabinet, Herr Wirth presented an unfinished analysis of Germany's financial condition, hurling billions of marks at the nation's treasury, and charging that the "wretched finances are but an expression of maladministration."

As a result of his frank exposition of finances, the cabinet unanimously voted to take up immediately the problem of the confiscation of coal fields, and ordered the minister of economy to prepare the draft of a law, based on the report recently compiled by the national commission for socialization.

Germany's total debt, including the funded debt of 11,000,000,000 marks, amounts to 242,700,000,000 marks, Herr Wirth declared.

The deficit in the current budget, according to Herr Wirth, will reach a total of 55,700,000,000 marks. Germany is facing claims for indemnities to subjects growing out of the war and the peace treaty totaling 131,000,000 marks.

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POLES-GIVE 10 DAYS TO ACCEPT TERMS OF TRUCE

In Case of Refusal Bolsheviks Will Start Winter Campaign.

PEACE PROSPECTS BRIGHT
Soviet Conditions Eliminate Plans Designed To Bolshelize Poland.

Riga, Latvia, Sept. 24.—Adolph Joffe, head of the Soviet peace delegation at today's session of the Russo-Polish peace conference, proposed an armistice, which he said must be accepted by the Poles within ten days or the Russian winter campaign would be inaugurated, which Joffe declared the Soviet Government desired to avoid.

The Soviet armistice terms decided upon yesterday eliminate virtually all conditions designed to sovietize Poland and abandon the Russian claims regarding Galicia, Joffe said.

M. Joffe's proposals made the prospect of peace much brighter than hitherto.
