

### CHURCH SHOULD NOT LEGISLATE FOR STATE

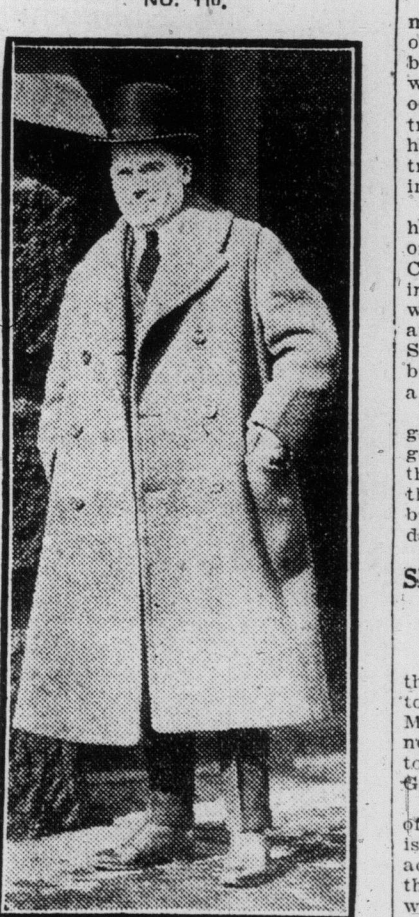
Mews of Prominent Churchmen on Decision in Marriage Issue.

### MIXED MARRIAGES LEGAL

That the recent decision handed down by the privy council in the celebrated Despatie-Tremblay mixed marriage in Quebec, as a result of an appeal financed by Orange societies in Canada, is a just one and a legal matter rather than a question of creed, is the opinion of such men as Rev. Father Minehan and Bishop Reeve, Rev. T. W. Neal, president of the Toronto Methodist conference; Canon Skey, Rev. John MacNeill, D.D., Rev. Byron Stauffer and Rev. W. A. Cameron.

"The decision has been reached because of the decision of the Loyola Orange Association of British North America to ascertain from the highest authorities whether the annulment of marriages by ecclesiastical courts, which is so frequent in Quebec, is a violation of the law of the land," said H.
