### CANADA GIVES TO THE ITALIAN **SUFFERERS**

Government Will Send \$100,-000 and an Appropriate Expression of Sympathy—Hon. Mr. Graham Talks of I. C. R.

Ottawa, Dec. 31-At this afternoon's cabinet council it was decided to contribute, on behalf of the Canadian government, the sum of \$100,000 towards the relief of the sufferers by the earthquake in southern Italy. The contribution will be forwarded through the colonial office, accompanied by an appropriate expression
