- (c) If, however, the Candidate has been rejected in one subject only, having shown fair proficiency in the others, he may be allowed to take that subject along with the work of the next Professional Examination.
- (d) In the case of a Candidate for the First Professional Examination failing to obtain the required percentage in two of the subjects, while he has distinguished himself in all the others, the Board of Examiners may recommend that the subjects passed be allowed to him, and that he shall take the other subjects over again with the work of the Second Professional Examination.

Graduates in Arts of this University with Honors in the Department of Natural Sciences, will be exempted from the First Professional Examination, and from the payment of the fee for the same. They will, however, be required to take Anatomy of that examination along with the Second Professional Examination.

No Candidate will be allowed to pass any of the Professional Examinations who has not obtained at least one-half of the marks allotted to such Examination. Nor will a candidate be considered as having passed any individual subject who has not obtained at least one-third of the marks allotted to such subject.

N.B.—This regulation will be enforced at once, and will be applicable to Undergraduates going out under the old Statute.

The Fee of each Professional Examination is Two Dollars, payable when the Candidate notifies to the Registrar his intention to present himself. A Candidate who has been rejected at one Professional Examination will be admitted to the same examination in the following year on payment of One Dollar.

Notice will be given annually, in January, of the days on which the Examinations for the year will commence. Every Undergraduate who proposes to present himself at a Professional Examination must send into the Registrar a statement (according to a printed form which will be furnished) of the course he is taking, whether Pass or Honor, of the Lectures he has attended, and of the practical instruction he has received, with the names of the Teachers and such other particulars as the printed form may indicate, together with the original certificates referred to in the statement.
