ADDITIONAL TRAIN SERVICE. ST. JOHN-FREDERICTON. Effect Sunday, June 18th. The Canada Pacific will inaugurate a Sunday service between St. John and Fredericton, effective Sunday, June 18th. GOMPERS ASSAILS SUPREME COURT

Tells Cincinnati City Club Coronado Decision Re-establishes Slavery for Labor—Sees Strike Right Denied.

Cincinnati, June 13.—Defying the United States Supreme Court to hold him accountable for his utterances, Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor, today assailed the court for its decision in the Coronado coal case.

Speaking before the City Club and a gathering of representative business and professional men and women of Cincinnati, Mr. Gompers said that he regarded the decision as a denial of the right to strike, and re-established "slavery and involuntary servitude, not for the black man alone, but for the white man and women of labor of the United States."

"Of course, the men of labor and the women of toil," he said, "will take action for the purpose of securing recognition of the hands of Congress of the wrong done by the decision of the Supreme Court. American Federation of Labor will take action to secure and obtain the relief from the proper channels—the Congress of the United States."

Speaking to the statement of the six railroad presidents at Chicago that union leaders were responsible for the strike situation, Mr. Gompers said the labor chiefs "were sitting on the safety valve to prevent a walk out."

"I am not satisfied with the idea that America's workers shall have the right to uphold the principle that they are opposed to involuntary servitude except as a punishment for crime, of which they shall be duly convicted," he said.

Referring to the Clayton act as exempting labor from the application of the Sherman Anti-Trust laws, he said: "In spite of the passage of this law the Supreme Court of the United States in its most recent decision in the Coronado case decided that an organization which has approved any local union's demand to be sustained in their position for an increase in wages or against a reduction of wages is responsible in damages and in treble damages under the Sherman Anti-Trust law."

"I would not want you to believe for a moment that the men in the labor movement, as I know them, are law-breakers, who would either directly or indirectly encourage lawlessness or violence, but I beg of you to consider the testimony of men in high name, in his business, who testified to the fact that fully one-third of their operating expenses is given over to private detective agencies and agents, provocateurs—men who provoke trouble and spy upon their fellows and to create a situation that would be any defence for the men of labor if they did anything of the kind. But what is to become of the workmen and women of America if that decision is to stand."

"If any employer or combination of employers, whether chambers of commerce, boards of trade, building contractors, employers in the moulders' trades, shoe trades—all of them—were to conspire, as the term is now popularly understood, or agree that the wages of their working people shall be reduced, and the working people shall apply to their officers of their national organization for financial or moral support in defence of that move to resist reduction in wages; and, supposing one or two, or half-dozen of the men, here and elsewhere, bona fide members of the union, would commit some overt act, and the organization of the international would be held responsible in treble damages, it

would simply mean that the organization, national or international, would never approve, such a movement for advance of their rights and interests. Other rivers protected are the Connecticut, Androscoggin, Saco and Merrimack, all important New England streams on which many manufacturers are dependent for power, and the Monongahela, which, with the Allegheny, has been the chief source of the flood so disastrous to Pittsburgh.

The new forest to be built up in northern Pennsylvania under the name of the Allegheny National Forest is to embrace more than 400,000 acres of streams in connection with timber production, that is, the cutting of which is to be done in a manner which will produce nothing of value and which in need of fire protection and forestry management to make the area again a productive asset to the state. All the forests in the ten states have an important function in connection with timber production, as they supply the nucleus of a future stand of hardwood timber and spruce for the Eastern States and Central New England. They also serve in a large measure as demonstration forests where the owners of nearby private lands can see the beneficial results which come from the protection of cut-over lands from fire and the increased growth and financial advantage of conservative forestry practice.

The commission recommends that the purchase of lands for forest reserves be extended by law to other states.

KING SQUARE CONCERT

The Carleton Cornet band will give a programme in the King Square bandstand on Tuesday evening and not in the West St. John stand, as scheduled. In making this announcement, the Mayor explained it had been planned to have each of the bands engaged for the season give their first concert in King Square. He added that the North End and Carleton will have more concerts than was originally planned.

NEW NATIONAL FORESTS

1,700,000 Acres Acquired in Eastern States Under Weeks Law. The purchase of more than 2,000,000 acres of forest lands by the United States has been approved and 1,700,000 acres have been acquired and put under administration as national forests in the Eastern States, in accordance with the provisions of the Weeks law, enacted March 1, 1911. The results of a decade of work under that law have been summarized by the National Forest Reservation Commission in its report for 1921, which has been submitted to Congress by Secretary of War Weeks, president of the commission.

The national forests created from the purchased lands lie in the States of Maine, New Hampshire, Pennsylvania, Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia. They have been established primarily to protect the head waters of twelve important river systems. This protection benefits not only navigation but also water-power development and provides a basis for a system of food

INDIAN MODERATE DENOUNCES GANDHI

Programme Complete Violation of Everything Advocated Prior to 1919.

Indore, India, May 7.—(By Mail)—Sir Sankaran Nair, formerly a member of the Viceroy's Council and also of the Secretary of State's Council, who recently returned from England, has expressed the lack of exposing what he considers the Gandhi's real aims for India. His opinions published under the title "Gandhi and Anarchy," constitutes a vigorous attack on Gandhi and an exposure of the dangers which Sir Nair sees in non-cooperation.

"Sir Nair has always remained loyal to the British government, and the gulf between him and Gandhi was made complete at the conference of Moderate leaders held at Bombay recently. In the course of his remarks on the Gandhi movement, he says: 'Though Gandhi himself and the majority of his followers were men who were not well-known in the Congress camp or in the strenuous days which preceded the introduction of the reform scheme, his party contained some men who were members of the old constitutionally elected Congress, who afterwards were turned into the present revolutionary Congress entirely under the leadership of Gandhi. There is scarcely an item in the Gandhi programme which is not a complete violation of everything preached by the foremost sons of India till 1919; which has not been strongly, even vehemently, denounced.'"

"The severe simplicity and austerity of Gandhi's life, combined with his appeal to the principle of 'Ahimsa' (non-injury), inherited from Hinduists and now ingrained in Hindu life, has secured him the support of the Hindu masses, and particularly vegetarians. His lip-lip demands has ensured the Mohamadist support. Some politicians who have followed him and the influence he has acquired for putting pressure on the government to join him in the cause of non-cooperation, have joined him. There are, of course, many genuine patriots who, believing in the old constitutionally elected Congress, also follow him. But I am satisfied he is trying them all to further his own ends, attempts in which he is bound to fail.'"

WORLD SHORT OF WHEAT.

Surplus From North America and India Almost Sole Supply. Washington, June 13.—World wheat stocks by July 1 will be lower than for several years, according to an analysis of the situation issued by the Commerce Department.

Both Argentina and Australia, the department explained, have considerably less wheat than last year, the United States carry-over will be light and only Canada has considerable stocks on hand. A larger demand than last year, it was declared, was indicated by the upward trend of European consumption, while the prospects are for a smaller crop.
